GEDUNG SATE

Gedung Sate Geographically located at coordinates 107°37'07"BT and 06°54'05"LS, Jalan Diponegoro No. 22, Village Cihaurgeulis, Bandung. Gedung Sate was founded in 1920 after a design by Dutch architect J. Gerber, Eh. De Roo, and G. Hendriks and van Gemeente Bandoeng chaired by VL Slors. Laying the first stone by Miss Johanna Catherina Coops (eldest daughter of B. Coops, Mayor Bandung) and Miss Petronella Roelofsen representing the Governor General of Batavia. Gedung Sate now serves as the governor's office of the West Java province in Indonesia. Its common name, Gedung Sate, is a nickname that translates literally from Indonesian to 'satay building', which is a reference to the shape of the building's central pinnacle - which resemble the shape of one of the Indonesian traditional dish called satay.



Gedung Sate ornament influenced Hinduism and Islam. On the front facade wall ornaments are characterized by traditional, such as building a Hindu temple, while in the middle of the main building Sate House, there is a tower with a roof stacking (overlapping) such as Meru in Bali or a pagoda roof. These buildings form a unique shape as a blend of eastern and western architectural styles. Arts style building that blends traditional architectural style with finesse Indonesia western construction technique called Indo-Eropeesche Architectur Stijl (Indo-European architectural style). At the top of the building there are six Sate skewers are represent six million guilders spent as construction costs.

MOUNT TANGKUBAN PERAHU

Mount Tangkuban Perahu is an active volcanic mount in West Java. Located at an altitude of 2084 m above sea level, this uniquely shaped mountain has attracted visitors for coming to look more closely at the crater, enjoying the panoramic view of the surrounding valley, as well as more familiar with the story of the famous people, Sangkuriang.

Based on the legend, the mountain is formed by anger Sangkuriang who feel failed in granting a request for a large lake and a boat from Dayang Sumbi (a story of forbidden love between a child and his own mother). Then kicked the boat that has been created and fallen facedown (in Sunda language is 'nangkub') in its current location - which became the origin of the name Mount Tangkuban Perahu. According to the geological history, Mount Tangkuban Perahu formed from recurring activities volcano eruption in prehistoric Sunda. Note 2 eruptions in the last century was in 1829, 1846, 1862, 1887, 1896, 1910, and 1929. From the top of the tower at the Gedung Sate Bandung, you can see very clearly the physical form Tangkuban Perahu really resembles an upturned boat .
